- Remember that you need an edited, two-clause sentence for each word. We wrote these together in
 class with sentence frames -- come in at lunch if you need help writing these or want me to edit your
 sentences before the test! NO TWO SENTENCES CAN BE THE SAME, AND THEY CANNOT BE
 COPIED FROM THE INTERNET OR ANYWHERE ELSE. IF SO, YOU WILL GET A ZERO!
- You will also be matching words to blanks in a paragraph on the test. For this, your notes should explain the meaning of each word in a way that makes sense to you so that you can use context clues from the paragraph to figure out where to put each word.
